He highlighted that gaining clarity about career paths requires curiosity and active participation. To that end, he urged students to not hesitate in asking questions during the session, as open dialogue is a key part of meaningful learning. His remarks set a motivating tone for the session, aiming to inspire students to take charge of their future career choices.



What makes an individual to choose a career in sports:

Students who have a passion for fitness, enjoy team sports, and possess strong leadership qualities may find a career in sports both exciting and fulfilling. This field is ideal for individuals who prefer to stay physically active and are enthusiastic about maintaining a healthy lifestyle. Additionally, students with a keen interest in subjects like biology, psychology, and human development can also thrive in sports-related careers, as these areas are closely linked to understanding athletic performance, mental well-being, and physical growth.



Those who are motivated by discipline, teamwork, and continuous self-improvement should consider exploring diverse opportunities in the sports sector, ranging from professional athletics, and coaching to sports science, physical education, and sports management.

Choosing a career in sports offers a dynamic and rewarding path for individuals passionate about physical activity and personal excellence. The sports industry is rapidly growing, offering a wide range of career opportunities beyond just playing professionally; such as coaching, sports management, physiotherapy, sports journalism, and fitness training. It also provides the prestigious opportunity to represent one's state or country at various levels. A career in sports promotes both physical and mental well-being, encourages discipline and teamwork, and fosters leadership skills. Moreover, professionals in this field often play a vital role in community building and social development by inspiring others and promoting

healthy lifestyles. For those who value active living and purpose-driven work, sports can be a fulfilling career choice.

Science in Sports: Sports Science:

Sports Science is an interdisciplinary field that focuses on understanding how the human body responds to physical activity and exercise. It draws knowledge from areas such as exercise physiology, biomechanics, sports psychology, nutrition, and injury rehabilitation to enhance athletic performance, prevent injuries, and promote overall health and well-being.

For example, exercise physiologists analyse how the body reacts to different levels of physical stress, helping athletes train more efficiently. Bio-mechanists study body movements and mechanics to improve performance and reduce injury risk. Sports psychologists work on athletes' mental health, focus, and motivation to help them perform under pressure. Sports nutritionists create diet plans tailored to optimize performance and recovery, while rehabilitation specialists assist in post-injury recovery using scientifically backed therapies.

Careers in sports science are not limited to professional sports. Opportunities exist in fitness and wellness centres, sports teams, rehabilitation clinics, research institutions, and educational settings. Individuals can work as performance analysts, strength and conditioning coaches, athletic trainers, or researchers. This field is ideal for those passionate about health, human biology, and helping others achieve their physical potential, making it a valuable and growing career path.



Courses after Grade 12:

After completing 12th standard, students in Odisha who are interested in building a career in sports have multiple academic pathways to choose from. One of the most common undergraduate programs is Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed.), which focuses on physical fitness, sports training, and teaching methodologies. Students can also pursue a B.Sc. in Sports Science, which covers a more scientific approach to sports, including anatomy, exercise physiology, biomechanics, and sports psychology.



Several universities and institutes in Odisha offer these courses, such as Utkal University, Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), and National Sports University campuses, where available. In addition to degree programs, there are certificate and diploma courses in areas like fitness training, strength and conditioning, sports coaching, and sports nutrition, offered by recognized training academies and sports institutes.

Some integrated programs combine sports science with physical education, offering students both theoretical knowledge and practical experience. These programs are suitable for students who aspire to become coaches, fitness experts, trainers, sports scientists, or even physical education teachers. With the growing focus on sports development in the state, career prospects in this sector are expanding rapidly.

The Government College of Physical Education (GCPE), Bhubaneswar, founded in 1957 and affiliated to Utkal University, offers a 2-year B.P.Ed. (Bachelor of Physical Education) program with 100 seats and an M.P.Ed. program with 40 seats, both recognized by NCTE and UGC. GCPE provides state-of-the-art facilities—library,

recognized by NCTE and UGC. Other government institutions like Tigiria College, Cuttack and Baliapal College, Balasore offer B.P.Ed. and C.P.Ed. (Certificate in Physical Education) programs with modest intake capacities.

Roadmap to become a Sports Coach:

Becoming a professional sports coach involves a structured process that combines passion, hands-on experience, formal education, and certifications. The journey typically begins with selecting a specific sport and actively participating in it to gain foundational knowledge and practical understanding. Candidates aspiring to become coaches must have passed at least the 12th standard and possess a strong background in physical fitness and sports.

Pursuing a degree in Physical Education (B.P.Ed. / M.P.Ed.) or specialized Sports Coaching programs provides a solid academic base. Certifications such as the NSNIS (Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports) Diploma in Coaching are widely recognized and often mandatory for formal coaching positions.



Additionally, sport-specific licenses and certifications offered by national sports federations or the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) can enhance professional credentials.

Hands-on exposure through internships or assistant coaching roles in state sports bodies, national federations, or elite training academies is crucial for real-world experience. Knowledge of sports nutrition, CPR, and first aid is highly recommended to ensure athlete safety and well-being.

Overall, a combination of education, certification, and practical exposure equips aspiring coaches with the skills and credentials necessary to build a long-term career in sports coaching across schools, clubs, academies, or national-level teams.



Opportunities for Sports Professionals:

A career in sports offers diverse employment opportunities across both government and private sectors. Government organizations such as the Sports Authority of India (SAI), Indian Railways, armed forces, and state and central police departments actively recruit talented athletes and sports professionals through sports quota. These positions often provide stable job opportunities with benefits, along with the chance to continue sports participation and representation at various levels.

In the private sector, opportunities are rapidly expanding. Fitness chains, sports academies, professional sports teams, educational institutions (schools and colleges), and corporate wellness programs regularly seek qualified sports professionals. These roles include coaching, athletic training, fitness consultation, and sports administration. In addition, event management companies involved in organizing sports tournaments and media houses focusing on sports journalism and broadcasting also hire professionals with a background in sports.

The field of sports science is especially promising, with roles such as sports scientist, exercise physiologist, strength and conditioning coach, bio-mechanist, sports psychologist, physical education (PE) instructor, sports nutritionist, and academic researcher. These professionals are in demand in both performance and rehabilitation settings, helping athletes reach their peak potential and recover effectively from injuries.

Salaries in sports science and related fields vary based on the role, qualifications, and experience. On average, professionals can expect to earn between ₹2.5 lakh to ₹10 lakh per annum. With further specialization and experience, particularly in high-performance sports or international settings, earnings can increase significantly, making it a rewarding and impactful career choice.



Sports management & Available Career Opportunities:

Sports Management is a dynamic and evolving field that deals with the business, organisational, and administrative aspects of sports. It plays a crucial role in ensuring the smooth functioning of sports teams, leagues, events, and athletes' careers. This domain includes a wide range of responsibilities such as team management, event planning, sponsorship handling, brand promotion, public relations, and athlete representation.

Key roles in this field of sports management include sports team manager, event coordinator, sports marketing executive, public relations officer, sports agent, and sponsorship manager. These professionals work closely with athletes, sports organisations, corporate sponsors, and media houses to promote and grow the business side of sports. To build a career in sports management, students from any academic stream (Arts, Science, or Commerce) can pursue undergraduate or postgraduate degrees. Popular courses include BBA, BA, B. Sc, MBA, M. Sc, and PG Diploma in Sports Management.

In terms of career prospects, sports management offers excellent growth opportunities. Professionals can earn between ₹3 lakh to ₹15 lakh per annum, depending on their role, experience, and the scale of the organization. The industry's rapid growth, fuelled by the commercialisation of sports, increasing sponsorships, and professional leagues, makes sports management a lucrative and impactful career option for passionate individuals.



Conclusion:

Sports as a career is gaining significant momentum in Odisha, with the state emerging as a national leader in sports development and infrastructure. For students in Classes 11 and 12 who are passionate about fitness, team spirit, competition, and leadership, sports offer a wide range of career pathways beyond just being an athlete. Fields like sports science, physical education, fitness training, physiotherapy, coaching, sports journalism, and sports management are rapidly expanding.

Odisha's government initiatives, such as the establishment of sports hostels, training centres, Khelo India programs, and partnerships with national sports bodies, have opened new avenues for youth to access quality training and career-building opportunities. Students can pursue academic courses like B.P.Ed., B.Sc. in Sports Science, or diplomas in fitness and coaching from reputed institutions within and outside Odisha.



With growing demand, strong state support, and professional guidance, a career in sports is now a viable and exciting option for Odisha's youth looking to turn their passion into a profession.
